



Freda's story December 2023

Service name: Intermediate Care at Ings

Grove.

Main purpose of service: For people who are medically stable but need a bit of extra rehabilitation to cope at home and remain as independent as they possibly can. The service provides 24-hour support and care at 3 different venues in Kirklees. Locala's rehabilitation team work along- side social care colleagues, helping guests to maximise their



independence, so they can carry out day to day activities.

About the person: Freda is 85 years old and was on a cruise with her husband when she fell in their cabin and broke her hip. She was transferred off the ship to a hospital in Greenland where she had surgery, eventually being air ambulanced back to the UK via Iceland. Freda came to Ings Grove for rehabilitation.

Rehabilitation: Freda says she was unable to walk when she first arrived at Ings Grove. Four weeks later she is progressing. "Now I can use a walking frame with wheels if someone is with me." She continues, "Claire and Olivia are my therapists. I do leg exercises, foot exercises and practice walking. Yesterday I walked to the window. We're going to start practising stairs." Freda feels everything is in "slow motion" and she "lies there thinking of everything." She is used to being busy. "The best bit about retirement is being able to do your cleaning and washing during the day not at night!" She has travelled extensively to New Zealand, the Canary Islands, Canada and has cruised the fjords.
