KEY ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2018-2019

- Zero MRSA bacteraemia for thirty five months
- Zero Clostridium Difficile infections for thirty six months
- Achieved 75% flu vaccine uptake
- Ratification of seven IPC Standard operating procedures/policies
- Trained 80 ANTT assessors

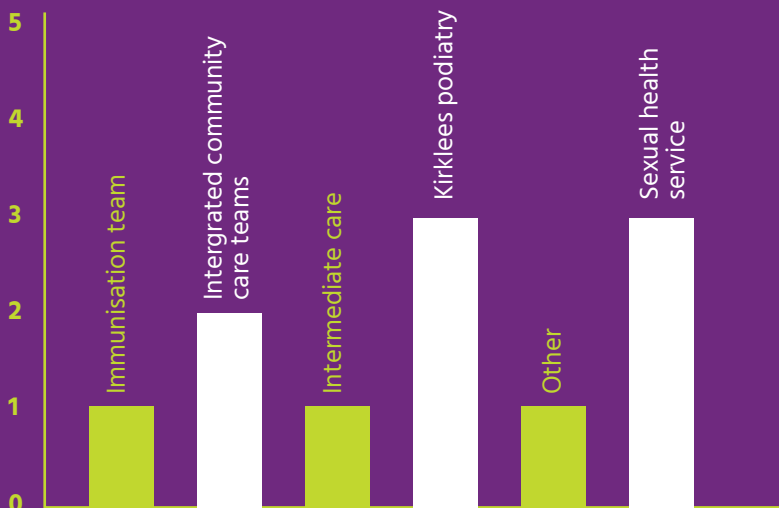

Clinical sharps incidents

Sharps incidents occurring by service from March 2018 - April 2019



Clinical sharps injuries and exposure to blood and high risk body fluid, have the potential to pass on blood borne viruses which may cause serious illness.

Actions taken:

All incidents are investigated by Infection Control lead and learning shared with clinical teams.

No incidents were RIDDOR reportable

Audit the use of safer sharps devices

Annual sharps audit by external company
